

## Fun Fact...

'Twas the night before Christmas, when all through the house, not a creature was stirring, not even a mouse.

The stockings were hung by the chimney with care, in hopes that Saint Nicholas soon would be there.

The children were nestled all snug in their beds, while visions of sugarplums danced in their heads.

And mamma in her kerchief, and I in my cap, had just settled our brains, for a long winter's nap...

According to legend, **Clement Clarke Moore** wrote his immortal poem, A Visit from St. Nicholas, also known as The Night Before Christmas, for his family on Christmas Eve in 1822. He never intended that it be published, but a family friend, Miss Harriet Butler, learned of the poem some time later from Moore's children. She copied it into her album and submitted it to the editor of the Trov (New York) Sentinel where it made its first appearance in print on December 23, 1823. Soon, the poem began to be reprinted in other newspapers, almanacs, and magazines, with the first appearance in a book in The New York Book of Poetry, edited by Charles Fenno Hoffman, in 1837.

It was not until 1844, however, that Moore himself acknowledged authorship in a volume of his poetry entitled *Poems*, published at the request of his children. One hundred and eighty years later, it is the mostpublished, most-read, most-memorized, and most-collected book in all of Christmas literature.




Secondary Education. Throughout her life, she spoke excellent Spanish, something most people never knew.


