## A Grand Teacher for Grand Marshal

The Poolesville Day Committee has selected Poolesville resident Grace Sheppard to be honored as the 2015 Poolesville Day Grand Marshal.

For thirty years, Grace Sheppard has guided students at Poolesville Elementary School (PES) through kindergarten, first, second, and third grades with a steady hand and an enormous heart. Grace's teaching career spans fifty years, with thirty-two years teaching for Montgomery County Public Schools.

Grace's service to the younger members of our community began in 1972, the year after she moved to Poolesville. She had a promise to keep to her young daughter, Stephanie, aged three at the time.

"Just after we moved, Stephanie asked me where all her friends were," Grace recalled with a smile. "I said, 'Don't worry, honey, I'll find you some friends'" —and, with that pledge, Grace created the Poolesville Community Preschool with Fran

Moore, Barbara Maxwell, and Cheryl Harelson, who also had small children. This first class of just seven preschoolers started a forty-two-year institution at the Poolesville Presbyterian Church. Grace left the preschool in 1985 and began her career at PES. The preschool was closed in 2014.

Grace's most recent contribution to Poolesville's young citizens is a Daisy Troop (think the littlest Brownies). Last year, she started the troop with four first-grade students and it quickly expanded to twelve. This year, she hopes to welcome another group of Daisies.

"I have oodles of wonderful memories. I never forget a student," Grace said. She recalls running into a former student in front of Selby's Market who would have been twenty-one at the time. He called out to her, "Hello, Mrs. Sheppard. Do you still give out those pretzels in your classroom?" She called back, "Yes, Chris, I do!"

## Town Government Report

### Poolesville Dog Park Woofficially Approved

The September 8 Poolesville commissioners' meeting had a room capacity turnout of residents to participate in a discussion about a proposed town dog park. The estimated cost of \$65,000 for the facility, which is scheduled for Dr. Thomas Dillingham Park, next to the current town skateboard park, was approved by a vote of the commissioners.

The park is to have two arenas to accommodate both large and small dogs, a pavilion to shelter waiting pet owners, and fencing. The largest part of the total expenditure is for the pavilion, estimated to be as much as \$40,000.

The commissioners had previously set aside up to \$65,000 for the facility but tabled the motion to approve late last spring for further review. An advocacy group, Poolesville Dogs, mustered many of its 136 members to attend the meeting to advocate for final passage measure. Michelle Riley and Kevin Roehner represented the organization by testifying on the merits of the park as well as to address public concerns raised about it.

In thanking the commissioners for their consideration of final approval, Riley noted that the group has already successfully put into motion a plan to obtain volunteers who will be dedicated to assisting in the maintenance of the park.

While the turnout was largely members of Poolesville Dogs, there were a number of residents present who voiced opposition to the park. The public comments were

accepted informally, without requiring residents to identify themselves, a departure from standard practice.

Opposing comments centered on construction costs, maintenance costs, possible liability to the town, questioning of its need and why non-dog owners should share the cost, and why, even if funded mostly by grants or budgeted surplus, the government would not choose to save the money rather than spend it.

Commission president, Jim Brown, and the town manager Wade Yost addressed these concerns.

Regarding cost, Yost said that the final costs could be smaller depending on the final design of the pavilion and result of bid proposals on its construction. It was also remarked that some kind of pavilion or protective coverage is standard for all town parks.

Brown pointed out that cost of maintenance is also standard town responsibility but that any volunteer assistance is most welcome. Riley explained that in a study of over seventeen dog parks, it was found that dog owners using the park overwhelmingly picked up after their own dogs and that owners who didn't were rare.

Commissioner Klobukowski's opposition to the park was concern over liability issues, but his point was moot since park liability protection is also a standard risk management issue for all parks. One former dog owner expressed that each dog owner should take full responsibility for his/her dog and that it was not a cost to be passed on to others. She objected to having to help pay for a park she would not be using. Brown countered that most parks are utilized by various segments of the population, pointing to the skateboard park,

## Commentary

### Feeding the Beast

A column I read the other day pointed out that Labor Day was, traditionally, the start of the full-bore presidential campaign season, following the parties' respective nominating conventions. The punch line is that this meant the Labor Day two months before the election, not the Labor Day fourteen months in advance. I suppose this is progress in some respects but certainly not in others. The world has gotten smaller, information moves more quickly and in more ways than ever imagined, but this critical process takes us much, much longer to accomplish. Of course, much of the expansion of the time it takes to select candidates comes from the primary system which replaced the storied smoke-filled convention rooms of yore (was that one cliché or several?) in order that we may have a more participatory process—but does it really have to be this long for democracy to be better served, or is some other factor at work?

Perhaps the multi-year slog simply feeds our insatiable hunger for twenty-four/seven entertainment. Content-hungry "cable" news stations, social media, and even celebrity news outlets feed at the same trough, benefiting from the steady flow of copy generated by candidates in all stages of the election process. The pseudo-event (aka the media event), an entity described by Daniel J. Boorstin back in the early 1960s is in full flower. Pseudo-events are by definition planned and not spontaneous. Boorstin said they are "dramatic, repeatable, costly, intellectually planned, social, cause other pseudo-events, and that one must know about it to be considered 'informed.'" If he had the chance to see what we are doing now, he might like to rethink "intellectually planned," or maybe I just need to accept that the phrase had a more nuanced meaning in 1961. As it is, I have difficulty attaching the word "intellectual" to any of our current political events, to say nothing of the decline of what passes for "informed."

The other factor encouraging longer campaigns is money, to no one's surprise. Whatever one might think

about private versus public campaign funding, the sums that are collected and spent on political campaigns at all levels are immense, to say nothing of the increasing funds being spent on national presidential campaigns. A lot of this money comes in very large donations to political action committees, and some candidates even specialize in collecting million-dollar-plus donations. It raises legitimate questions about just who is getting served by all this, and given the progress of the race so far, it could very possibly become a significant issue in at least one of the parties and maybe even the final head-to-head race, although if two big-money, big-donor candidates win the nomination, which is probably what will happen, it may not be an issue at all.

A lot of media outlets and a lot of people are collecting a lot of money, so it occurs to me that this has more than a little to do with the length of our campaign season. If almost limitless funds are available, then there probably wouldn't be time to spend it all in a short campaign. Do candidates need a lot of money because the campaign season is so long, or is the campaign season long because there's so much money to spend? I suspect it's more the latter than the former, especially since the earliest event of all, along with forming committees and all that stuff, is hitting up donors. This is a self-perpetuating beast with a talent for gathering the money it needs to thrive. Don't expect presidential elections seasons to get shorter any time soon, although I'm happy to note that they are capped at four years. They are, aren't they, or could they really start sooner, before the previous election is over? It may happen. The money is there, and it might be entertaining.

None of this really had anything to do with what I really wanted to write about, which is Poolesville Day, or Upcounty Day as people from Barnesville and Dickerson and other far flung locales like to call it. As one of the few communities in the county that can shut down its main drag without paralyzing traffic for several square miles all around, the Town of Poolesville puts on the signature event of the year, and you have the opportunity to be there. Please enjoy the guide in this issue, and we hope you will patronize our advertisers, who made all of this possible. Have a great Poolesville Day.

### Past Crime

**September 12, 1975** A two-year-old boy was seriously injured when he leaned away from a babysitter who was carrying him. Montgomery County Police said that the eleven-year-old babysitter was waiting to cross Clopper Road near the community of Boyds when the boy leaned away from her, and his head was struck by a passing car driven by a nineteen-year-old Boyds resident. No charges were placed, and the boy was reported to be in serious condition at Suburban Hospital.

**September 21, 1972** A Rockville woman was killed during a high-speed chase through the streets of Rockville. Police said that the thirty-one-year-old woman had been stopped for a traffic violation but then refused to sign the ticket and took off at a high rate of speed. At Route 355 and College Drive, she lost control, went up an embankment, hit several signs, and then overturned. She was taken to the hospital where she died. The same woman had been arrested just a few weeks previously after she threatened officers with a meat cleaver.

**September 21, 1973** A Montgomery County grand jury declined to indict a thirty-five-year-old army staff sergeant in the slaying of his seventy-eight-year-old neighbor. About a month earlier, the elderly man had gone for a walk at about 1:30 a.m. and then apparently became confused and tried to enter the wrong house. The homeowner retrieved a gun that he had in the house and shot through the front door, killing the neighbor. The grand jury decided that the death was accidental.

**September 23, 1972** Four students at Julius West Junior High School were arrested and charged with raping a thirteen-year-old fellow student. Police said that the boys and the girl were in the auditorium when they lured the girl behind a curtain. Two boys raped her while the other two held her down. Two of the boys were released to their parents while the other two were committed to the Maryland Training School.

### Drs. Pike & Valega: Family Dentists Who Love Living and Working in Poolesville

When Drs. D. Timothy Pike and Margaret Valega first opened their dentistry practice in Poolesville in October 1988, they started their practice from scratch. Poolesville only had two neighborhood developments at the time, and there was another part-time dentist in town. Originally, they looked into opening a practice in Olney, Dr. Valega's hometown, when they learned about office space for rent in the original two-story brick office building located on Fisher Avenue near West Willard Road.

Shortly after moving to Poolesville, many new neighborhood developments were approved and built. They moved their practice to a larger white home-like building in 1994, located across from the CVS building on Fisher Avenue. The bright blue awning, beautiful landscaping, and large free-standing clock welcome guests and add character to the setting. Patients are treated to views of artistic decorations, bird-feeders, and abundant wildlife located outside each treatment room window.

Friendly hygienists, assistants, and office staff members welcome patients of all ages from young children to senior adults. Today, Pike & Valega, DDS has nine full or part-time employees—many who have worked at the office for over ten years, and one hygienist has been with them for over twenty-one years.

"Poolesville just felt right," said Dr. Pike who grew up in Brockton, Massachusetts and graduated from Boston University with a Bachelor of Arts in Science. While working as an orderly at a hospital, Pike realized he was drawn to dentistry and oral surgery.

Dr. Valega grew up in Olney and graduated from Georgetown University with a Bachelor of Science. After working for one year as a full-time dental assistant, Dr. Valega decided she wanted to pursue a career as a dentist.

Both Drs. Pike and Valega enrolled at Georgetown University School of Dentistry where they met in their first year. "Freshman year we were friends, sophomore year we started dating, we got engaged in our junior year, and we got married during spring break of our senior year," said Dr. Valega. They married at the Dahlgren Chapel on the Georgetown University campus in 1986, the same year that they each received their Doctorate of Dental Surgery.

After graduating, the couple moved to New York where Dr. Pike began a two-year advanced general practice residency while Dr. Valega worked at various dental practices until they moved to Poolesville to live and work. Pike and Valega found Poolesville to be a wonderful location to both raise a family and grow their business. They purchased a home in town, became active in the community, and raised their three boys: Ryan, Alexander, and Conner.

Community service has always been important to the couple. When their boys were growing up, Dr. Pike was an Assistant Scout Master with the Boy Scouts. Additionally, he served on many boards and committees in town and currently serves on the Parks and Planning Advisory Board. In 2012, Dr. Pike won a community service award from the Poolesville Area Chamber of Commerce. Dr. Valega volunteers her time conducting alumni interviews for students applying to Georgetown University and also volunteers at events with the Montgomery County Road Runners Club.

The cause that Pike and Valega are extremely proud of is the large donation box built by their son Alex and prominently displayed in front of their office building. The box holds food donations dropped off by area residents and clients for the local area charitable organization, WUMCO (Western Upper Montgomery County Help, Inc.). Every month, the box is

### PHS Field Hockey: Passing the Torch

In September of 2000, Regina Grubb took the reins of Poolesville's field hockey team as coach. She replaced her old coach, Nancy Hopkinson, who had led the Indians for nineteen seasons, winning three 1A state tournaments. Grubb guided the Indians-then-Falcons into the 2A division, winning several region titles and making two state final appearances and earning a berth in the state semi-final last season. More importantly, she established a program that could consistently go head to head with the established lower county 4A powers like Bethesda-Chevy Chase and Churchill.

Fifteen years have passed, and Grubb has handed the torch to Rachel Stream, one of her former players. As a player with the Falcons from 2004 to 2007, Rachel set the school record for scoring with fifty-five career goals. She was a two-time first team selection by the *Washington Post* and the MVP in 2007. She was also a star athlete in basketball and softball while a student at PHS, but field hockey was her first choice, and she played at the college level at Old Dominion.

As a coach, her team will move up to the 3A division for the first time this year. The Falcons' first game is against B-CC, currently ranked second in the area by the *Washington Post*. The senior girls and their coach are looking forward to the challenge that the new season will bring.

"We have a lot of younger girls on our team," said senior defensive back Carley Kenly, "and we're playing different teams that are at a higher level than we were last year. I am looking forward to the games against QO and Damascus—and B-CC which is our first game. It's different playing for Coach Stream, but she was with us last year, so we know how she is and what she expects, and we are ready to play with her. There is a high standard here. We want to be better than we were last year. A couple of younger players that should do well for us this year are Rachel Bupp, a freshman forward, and Sapna Bagalkotkar is a sophomore forward."

"I am looking forward to getting out there with the girls, working hard, and winning games," said senior midfielder Jolee Raines. "We lost a few really good players, and they were our big hitters, so now we've got speed and we have got to work around that. I don't know anything about Damascus this year, but I am sure it will be a tough game and we will have to play our hardest."

"I am looking forward to all of us working together, and all of our hard work and running in practice paying off in games," said senior defensive back Christina Hilton, "and to us really connecting between one another on the field. We want to show Rachel what we can do and how we can take things that she has given us into the game. I think we have an overall good team. I think we have a stronger offensive background, but our defense is strong as well. We have a goalie, Mackenzie Gross, a junior, who came up from the JV last year. She is replacing Amanda De Soto, our goalie last year, and she is really stepping up."

"I am really excited about this season," said senior back Casey Harkins. "I think we have a lot to work with which is why we are going to push ourselves. I think the B-CC game will be a good game. That went into double overtime and strokes last year. It ended in a tie. I think we are ready to redeem ourselves and come out with a win in that game... Is there a different feel to it, playing for a new coach? Yeah, it is very intense this season. It was intense last year, but it was relaxed at times as well. I think that Rachel, as a new coach, pushes us very hard in practice so that we come out strong in games."

"I have had Carley, Jolee, Christina, and Casey and the rest of the seniors since they have been freshmen," said Coach Stream. "I have had them all four years as JV and now as



filled with hundreds of pounds of donated food that is distributed area-wide by WUMCO staff and volunteers to local area families in need.

Pike and Valega both enjoy the personal interaction they have with each of their patients, many who have become friends over the years. They encourage patients to come regularly for routine cleanings to maintain optimal oral health.

"If you come twice a year, your dental needs are minimal," said Dr. Valega. "Decay doesn't hurt until it's close to the nerve or in the nerve, so people don't even know when they have cavities."

Another important reason to have regular checkups is for regular oral cancer screenings which are performed after every cleaning. Dr. Valega recalls one patient who had a lesion discovered during a regular exam. Fortunately, the cancer was caught early, and the patient was successfully treated.

Dr. Pike said that many residents, especially in the new developments, are not aware that Poolesville's water system does not have fluoride added to it; therefore, they recommend fluoride treatments and prescription fluoride vitamins for children to help promote stronger teeth.

tot lots, and ball fields as specialized facilities not necessarily used by the population at large.

As to the source of the funds, Yost explained that over a period of time, the town, through direct taxation or from developer impact fees, has set aside funds to be used specifically for park development/maintenance. The town also applied for and has obtained grants from the state. Currently, the town holds on hand \$55,000 in grant park money and has applied for another \$70,000 in other grants. The current park budget shows \$155,000 available (surplus) for expenditure.

Brown remarked that although it is very true that no matter the source of the money, it is still provided by taxpayers; however, he questioned the wisdom of the town not accepting state grants as that action alone will not save taxpayer money since it will be spent elsewhere regardless of whether Poolesville uses it or not.

Prior to the final vote, attendees offered various human benefits of the park over and above its animal

usage as being another unique source of socialization. One woman explained how, as a non-parent, she does not obtain the socialization benefits of sharing tot lots with other mothers, while another young woman described how much going to dog parks elsewhere has been a joyous experience for her family and that she would love to have one in Poolesville.

The commissioners voted in favor of the dog park expenditure on a 4-1 vote, with Commissioner Klobukowski in opposition. Klobukowski had preferred to offer the proposal for a plebiscite during this fall's elections. This was rejected on the basis that no other park or specific expenditure by the town has ever been re-delegated from the commissioners to residents.

**Ordinance Change Considered**

On other town matters, the commissioners have been weighing an ordinance change that would make it mandatory for residents and commercial establishments to place their trash in appropriate lidded receptacles for collection. The thrust of the legislation is to address growing public concern over the disturbance and public nuisance of a flock of vultures in

town—vultures being attracted to open trash bins. Town residents and commercial establishments not using closed receptacles would face fines. Without closed receptacles, an effort to ameliorate the vulture problem will be limited at best. A public hearing is scheduled at the next commissioner meeting on September 21 at 7:00 p.m. at the town hall.

**Water and Sewer  
Allocation Considered**

The commissioners will be considering a report from the planning

commission regarding replacing the current water and sewer allocation process. The current program expires on December 31, 2015 and any unused water or sewer taps previously allocated will no longer be in effect. The goal of the new allocation process will be to encourage more immediate use of any allocated tap and to obtain tap fee funds on a very timely basis. A final draft on a proposal is being developed and will be released in the coming weeks.
